The Badlands Quilters Guild welcomes you to our 29th retreat. The 2023 retreat offers many different classes with varied projects and difficulty levels. Hopefully you will find several that interest you. There is also a free sewing area where you are able to continue work on a class project, prep for a class or work on whatever you like!

This year's Retreat will include all day Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Friday's noon meal will be included in the Retreat package.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES:

MEMBER registration begins on July 1. (Dues must be paid by March 31st to register as a member) Classes will be filled on a first come basis.

NON Members can start registration after August 1st.

Please be sure to indicate a second choice for each time slot in case your first choice for a class is full or canceled. THE BEST WAY TO INSURE YOUR CHOICE OF CLASSES IS TO REGISTER BEFORE THE SEPTEMBER 1st CANCELLATION DATE!!

CANCELLATION POLICY & CLASS CHANGES-BQG reserves the right to cancel classes that do not meet the minimum class size. In the event that a class must be canceled, notification will be made once the retreat committee meets after the September 1st deadline. As registrations are received, a notice will be posted on the Badlands Quilters Guild Facebook page when a class has been cancelled due to insufficient number of participants. After the classes offered are finalized, you will be notified by email a list of your classes. It is suggested that you refrain from purchasing class supplies until you know the class will be offered. Last minute registrations are welcomed, but acceptance will be based on class availability. A class may be full or require a kit or pattern not available on short notice. *OPEN SEWING-An area will be available to open sew, prep for classes or work on a project of your choice. If you wish to stay and sew after the evening meals or Friday PM class, keep in mind that we need to be out of the building at 11:00pm and classes end at 4pm on Sunday. Everyone needs to be packed and gone from the building by 5pm. The facility is rented for these hours and there are extra charges if they are not followed.

*CHALLENGE BLOCKS- More information will be in your retreat package.

BOOKS, PATTERNS, KITS-Book, pattern and kit fees are payable to the teachers at the beginning of the class. Be sure to contact local teachers or retreat chair prior to the retreat to reserve what you need, or if you need assistance.



Friday all day



59in x 72in Woven Jewelbox is a fresh modern approach to asymmetrical design. This quilt with its simple piecing makes a dramatic impact with color placement and 60-degree angles. No tedious piecing here! This quilt is a real crowd pleaser. Pattern is a Cut Loose Pattern. If you can't find it at your local store then go to KristaMoser.com/cutloose-press

What to bring to class

- Sewing machine in good working order
- ¼" foot for your machine
- Rotary cutter, and mat
- Basic sewing supplies, scissors (large and small), seam ripper, straight pins
- Thread to match fabric
- 60° Diamond Creative Grids LARGE Diamond Ruler (cuts up to 8½")
- Woven Jewel Box Pattern Fabric requirements:
- 1¼ yd ea. of four different background neutrals

- ½ yd of dark gray to frame 8 diamonds
- ¼ yd of light gray to frame 4 diamonds
- One 2½" strip ea. of four shades in four different colors, light to dark (these will be your jewel boxes)
- ½ yd binding fabric

Pre Cutting:

Note: if you want to precut before class to save time you will need:

- (15) 2½" strips of each of background neutrals
- (6) 2½" strips of dark gray fabric
- (3) 2½" strips of light gray fabric

Fractured Fun - Vickie Loh



Friday all day

The definition of fracture is to break, split or crack. You will fracture four identical repeats of fabric along shifted lines, rearrange them and then sew them back together. The fun comes when the final seam is sewn and each quilt is a unique one-of-a-kind fracture.

FABRIC

You will need four identical repeats of fabric. Just for fun, you may wish to incorporate a fifth fabric repeat into the backing of your quilted project to show the difference between the original fabric and the completed project when finished. Good fabric choices are large scale prints with clear detail against a plain or small scale background. Large floral or scenery pictures work well. Large geometric shapes that have flowing lines can be quite interesting and will produce bold abstract quilts. Four panels also are an excellent choice.

SUPPLIES

BSK

RCE

Thread

Post-it notes or small pieces of paper to mark your fabric strips

Stick pins – bring plenty, you may need 50-75. As you handle your strips of fabric, the post it notes may lose their sticking ability and stick pins hold them to the fabric.

Stripology Ruler and ironing Strip Stick are not mandatory and don't feel obligated to buy, but if you have them bring them. Those who have them can share.

2023 Panel Mystery Quilt – Kathy Johnson

Friday Evening

54" X 72" lap or large wall hanging

Sewing Machine Rotary Equipment

General Sewing Supplies Panel – Portrait Orientation

You will be making a lot of flying geese units. A 2" X 4" Bloc-Loc ruler or a Deb Tucker Wing Clipper will be very helpful but optional. They both work great and will make flying geese units so much easier.

Fabrics:

Panel – this needs to be 24 %" X 40 %". If your panel is too small you will need to add borders to get it up to size. If you are only a bit short, you may want to trim a little more off the panel to get a border that is going to work for you.

I recommend that you not use directional fabrics for any of your fabrics

Background Fabric – 2 ¾ yards

Fabric A- $\frac{3}{4}$ yard Fabric B - $\frac{5}{4}$ yard Binding - $\frac{1}{4}$ yard

<u>Cutting and sewing before class:</u> The cutting and sewing are going to take quite a while so don't wait until the last minute! I used my Stripology Ruler for cutting when convenient.

Cut 72-3" squares of background from 6 – 3" strips

Cut 13 - 5 %" squares from fabric A from 2 - 5 %" strips

Cut 5-5%" squares from fabric B from 1-5%" strip

*You will be making 2" X 4" finished flying geese units from the above cuts using the 4 at a time method before coming to class.

Cut 3 – 2 ½" strips WOF of fabric C

Cut 3 – 2 ½" strips WOF of background

*Sew pairs together of the background and fabric C strips and press toward C.

*Sub- cut the strips into 16 - 4 ½" squares and 12 - 2 ½" X 4 ½" rectangles

Cut 12 – 4" squares each from fabrics A, B and C.

Cut 36 – 4" squares of background fabric

*You will make 3" finished half-square triangles. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the background fabrics. Sew on each side of the line. Cut on the drawn line for 2 half-square triangles. Press half of each color toward the dark and half toward the background. Trim them to 3 ½".

Cut 24 - 2'' squares of each color, A, B and C. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the squares.

Cut 2-3" squares of background fabric and 2-3" squares of Fabric A. Use these to make 4- half-square triangles trimmed to $2 \frac{1}{2}"$.

Cut 7 – 2 ½" strips of background

Cut 3 – 1 ½" strips of background

Cut 7 – 3 ½" strips of background


Cut 4 – 2 ½" X 4 ½" rectangles

Making Flying Geese units 4 at a time


Make 52 – flying geese units from fabric A and Background

Make 20 – flying geese units from fabric B and Backgound


- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 2 of the small (3") squares.
- 2. Place marked squares on opposite corners of the large (5 ½") square
- 3. Sew a quarter inch of each side of the drawn line. Not a scant quarter inch.
- 4. Cut along the drawn line.



5. You will have 2 units that look like the illustration below. **Press toward the large triangle.**



- 6. Draw a diagonal line on 2 more small background squares.
- 7. Place a marked small square on the corner of each section.
- 8. Sew a quarter inch on each side of the drawn line.



- 9. Cut along the drawn line. Press to the small triangle.
- 10. Trim each unit to 2 ½" x 4 ½"

Crayon Box Mini - Denise Fried

Friday Evening



Who doesn't remember the fun and excitement of a new box of crayons. The sight of all those fresh coloring tools with perfect points is like unlocking a rainbow of color and endless creative fun. Let's remember that excitement with a crayon box mini wall hanging. There will be basic piecing, easy paper piecing and even some applique for this project.

Finished Quilt Size – 28 ½" x 39" Fabric Requirements –

1 Crayola Fat Eighth Box (can find

online) or 10 different fat eighths (9" x 18") for your crayons.

Accent for crayons - 1/2 yard black solid

Background – 5/8 yd white solid

Binding – 1/3 yd

Additional supplies:

Add a Quarter ruler.

I will provide patterns, paper piecing pattern, and applique pattern. I will bring Steam a Seam 2 for each quilter to use for the applique.

Cutting instructions prior to class:

- 1. From each colored fat eighths cut: 1 rectangle 4" x 17 ½" and 1 rectangle 4" x 4 ½".
- 2. From background solid white cut:
 - a. Cut one strip 4 ½" x WOF. Sub cut into 10 rectangles 4" x 4 ½". Label as piece C
 - b. Cut one strip 4 ½" x WOF. Sub cut into 20 2" x 4 ½" rectangles.
 - c. Cute 4 strips 2 ½" x WOF for Border

Entangled Sky – Krista Moser

The Entangled Sky quilt is made entirely out of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and is deceptively easy to assemble. All the magic happens with three shades of each color, in light, medium, and dark. Constructed essentially from two different blocks, get a 3D effect by arranging the A and B blocks to meet Saturday All Day – Oct.14, 2023 8:30 am - 11:30 am & 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm

each other. Achieve a complicated architectural look without all the fussy piecing.

What to bring to class

- Sewing machine in good working order
- ¼" foot for your sewing machine
- rotary cutter, ruler, and mat
- Basic sewing supplies, scissors (large and small),

seam ripper, straight pins

- Thread to match background fabric
- Fabric marking pen
- Creative Grids 60° diamond ruler 8½" (can be purchased in classroom)
- Entangled Sky Pattern (can be purchased in classroom)

Fabric requirements

5/8 yd each of 3 shades of purple: light, medium and dark.

5/8 yd each of 3 shades of coral: light, medium and dark.

5/8 yd each of 3 shades of gold: light, medium and dark.

¼ yd each of 3 shades of blue: light, medium and dark.

3½ yds backing fabric

Pre Cutting


(all strips are cut selvage to selvage)

Note: if you want to precut your strips before class to save time, you will need

- (2) 2½" strips from each blue sky fabric.
- (7) 2½" strips from each shade of purple fabric, light, medium and dark
- (7) 2½" strips from each shade of coral fabric, light, medium and dark
- (7) 2½" strips from each shade of gold fabric, light medium and dark

Aunt Joe's Afghan – Kathy Johnson

Saturday All Day



Aunt Joe's Afghan is a striking quilt pattern that looks like a crocheted afghan. This is a great scrap buster

Supplies:

Sewing Machine
General Sewing Supplies
Rotary Equipment
Optional – Stripology Squared Mini
Ruler

Fabrics:

3 ½ yards of black This is a scrap quilt, so total yardage is not given for the other fabrics

For each block you will need three fabrics plus the black.


Center – 2 ½" X 8 ½" (orange)

Middle – 3 ½" X 12 ½ (purple)

Outer – 5 ½" X 9 ½" (green)

Black - 3 ¾" X 10 ½"

Before class you will want to starch your fabrics so they are stiff. These are small pieces and that will help with getting better cuts and seams. The pieces are a little larger than you actually will need in case they shrink when you starch them. When I cut my scraps I cut a center, middle and outer piece from each scrap so that I could use the same fabric in different positions in different blocks.



Deco - Kris Jacobson



Saturday All Day

Deco by Lo & Behold Stitchery is a commemoration to both the Roaring 20s and our current decade. Traditional piecing creates the Art Deco look of this quilt. You have a choice of three sizes and each size has a different look. This picture shows the Bed size quilt (102" x 102"). If you love the look of this quilt but want less piecing check out the baby size quilt. The pattern also gives you a choice of color schemes,

modern (shown above) or traditional (2 colors) color scheme.

Pattern is required. You can purchase at your local quilt store or online at Lo & Behold Stitchery. Fabric requirements will depend on which color scheme you choose. This is for the quilt shown.

Class Prep

Read through your pattern. If you are doing the Modern color scheme, I recommend you make a swatch chart with a swatch of each fabric and which color number it is.

Precut your fabric to make 4-5 of each of the blocks. **DO NOT** cut all the fabric as I have some recommendations for you. A stripology ruler or similar strip cutting ruler is helpful.

This pattern requires accurate and consistent seam allowances. If you are unsure of how to find your scant quarter inch seam allowance we will discuss this in class.

Pre-sewing: For Block 3A and 3B do one of each strip set.

Class supply list:

Basic sewing supplies Rotary cutting Supplies Sewing machine Optional: A seam stick to iron seams open, seam guide for accurate seam allowances, Stripology Ruler.

Double Starburst – Teresa Hecker

Saturday All Day



This is a fun project using Sew Kind of Wonderful's newest ruler, the Quick Straight Ruler™. They have many patterns for its use. The blocks are large at 21 inches so this could easily be made smaller for a bed/table runner or wall hanging. The ruler makes this complex block achievable for any quilter. Please check your local quilt store for the Double Starburst pattern and Quick Straight Ruler™. They can also be purchased online at www.sewkindofwonderful.com



Materials:


- (16) 1/3 yard cuts assorted focus fabrics (I used 8 prints and 8 Chalk and Charcoal blenders)
- (8) 7/8 yard cuts assorted back ground neutral fabrics (OR 6-1/2 yards of one background fabric)
- 2/3 yard binding fabric
- 5 yards backing fabric
- Quick Straight Ruler™

Sew Square 10™ (recommended or a 10" or 12" square ruler) 15" straight edge ruler or longer (I have an 18" but 24" is fine) Basic sewing and rotary cutting supplies

Precutting before class: You should do the cutting in the first box in the pattern "General cutting for 16 Double Starburst Blocks" or enough to make 2-3 blocks. I used scrappy black and whites for my 1" sashing-accent pieces. The pattern has them cut from focus fabrics.

City Girl Chevron – Krista Moser

Sunday All Day



Not your sisters Chevron Quilt

Do you want to make a Chevron Quilt, but need a little more pizazz than the tried and true? This fun take gives you the option of using multiple color combinations in one quilt. Use gold accent strips to make these Chevron diamonds sparkle. Or lay out your diamonds light to dark for an ombre effect.

This quilt is entirely strip pieced and foolproof. No fussy piecing techniques. If you are just getting into quilting, this would be a good next step on your new quilting journey.

Beginner/Intermediate

Full Size 72"x 90" Lap Size 64.5" x 74"

What to bring to class

- Sewing machine in good working order
- ¼" foot for your sewing machine
- Rotary cutter, ruler, and mat
- Basic sewing supplies, scissors (large and small), seam ripper, straight pins
- Thread to blend with the fabric
- Creative Grids 60° Triangle ruler at least 8½" size, or Creative Grids 60° Large Diamond ruler (cuts up to 8½")

City Girl Chevron Pattern

Fabric requirements for full size quilt

1/3 yd of 6 different white fabrics 1/3 yd of 6 different dark gray fabrics 11/8 yd accent gold

Fabric requirements for lap size quilt

1/3 yd of 4 different white fabrics 1/3 yd of 4 different dark gray fabrics ¾ yds accent gold 1/3 yd of 6 different medium gray fabrics 11/8 yd accent black

1/3 yd of 4 different medium gray fabrics 3/4 yds accent black


Pre-Cutting Instructions

Before class, pre-cut the colored fabrics into 2½" strips. You will need a total of (72) 2½" strips for the Full size or (48) 2½" strips for the Lap size.

Pre-cut the accent black and accent gold fabrics into 1%" strips. You will need (24) strips from each accent fabric for the full size or (16) strips from each fabric for the lap size.

Color Outside the Lines – Vickie Loh





Here is a sweet little wallhanging that will steal your heart. This 23" x 26" cutie lets you play with all of the fun crayon colors in your fabric stash. It uses 1 ½" strips of colored fabrics for the pencils, and includes a mini paper piecing lesson within the pattern to help you make accurate pencil points. I will add a few extra tips to make the paper piecing super easy. What a neat gift for the artist in the family or that special teacher.

SUPPLIES

ruler

Color Outside the Lines Mini pattern – google it and find lots of places to order online. BSK (basic sewing kit) RCE (rotary cutting equipment) Post-it notes

Add-a-quarter ruler or small 1"x6"

Flat flower head pins Ironing strip stick (not mandatory, bring if you have one) small Ziploc bag (pint size)

PRE-CLASS INSTRUCTIONS

A paper piecing pattern is included for the pencil points. I will provide the copies you need for class. The pattern also includes a colored quilt assembly diagram. On the diagram, number the top row of pencils from 1 to 21, and the bottom row 22 to 42. Number 42 post-it notes. Following the cutting instructions and the diagram, cut your fabrics accordingly and pin a post-it note to each corresponding pencil fabric. When cutting the background fabric, cut borders first and make them at least ½" longer than the instructions say. This gives you a little "wiggle room" if your seams aren't perfectly ¼", and can be trimmed later. Finally, take a one yard piece of any fabric in your stash and pin all of your cut pieces to it following the assembly diagram. Gently fold it up for safe transport to class. Bring your extra fabric to class in case of an error.

Color 1 – (44) 5 ½" squares

Color 3 – (44) 5 ½" squares

Scrappy Quilt

(131) 5 ½" triangles

For my 3 color scrappy quilt I chose 11 reds, 11 oranges and 11 pinks from my scraps and cut 4 - 5 ½" squares from each fabric.

Walk the tightrope with arms stretched out for balance. This quilt is great for that favorite jelly roll, layer cake or a collection of favorite fabrics.



*Print Blocks – 1 Jelly Roll or Layer Cake or a mix of fabric for variety Plus symbols (should complement print but be in contrast to background) – 5/8 yd Background – 3 ½ yd

Binding – 5/8 yd (not needed for class)
Backing – 4 ¼ yd (not needed for class)

Cutting instructions prior to class: From Jelly Roll or Layer Cake or variety of fabric:

1. Cut (for Wall/Lap) 34 – 9" x 2

 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles or cut (for Large) 62 – 9" x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.

- 2. Select 2 fabrics to use for accent Plus symbols.
 - a. Cut 1-7" x 1" rectangle and $2-3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangles

From Plus Symbol Fabric:

Wall/Lap

- 1. 22 7" x 1" rectangles
- 2. $44-3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 1' rectangles Large
- 1. 38 7" x 1" rectangles
- 2. $76 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 1" rectangles

Background Fabric for Wall/Lap

- 1. Cut $4 3 \frac{1}{2}$ WOF strips. Sub cut:
 - a. $2 30'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}''$
 - b. 28 3 ½" x 3 ½"
- 2. Cut 1-7" WOF strip. Sub cut:
 - a. $2-9" \times 7"$
 - b. $2-6" \times 7"$

- c. $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7"
- 3. Cut 9 3'' WOF strips. Sub cut:
 - a. $6 40^{\circ} \times 3^{\circ}$
 - b. $2 17 \frac{1}{2}$ x 3"
 - c. $4 11 \frac{1}{2}$ x 3"
- 4. Cut 14 1 ½" WOF strips. Sub cut:
 - a. 34 11 x 1 ½"
 - b. $68 2 \frac{1}{2}$ x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ "
- 5. Cut from the remaining fabric:
 - a. 17 5" x 1" rectangles.

Background Fabric for Large:

- 1. Cut 6 3 ½" WOF strips. Sub cut:
 - a. $4 21'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}''$
 - b. $2 12'' \times 3 \frac{1}{2}''$
 - c. $36 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 2. Cut 1 9" WOF strip. Sub cut:
 - a. $2 7'' \times 9''$
 - b. $4 6'' \times 7''$
- 3. Cut 14 3" WOF strips. Sub cut:
 - a. $8 40'' \times 3''$
 - b. $5 22 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3"
 - c. $6 11 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3"
 - d. 2-7" x 2 ½"
- 4. Cut 25 1 ½" WOF strips. Sub cut:
 - a. 62 11" x 1 ½"
- 5. Cut from remaining fabric:
 - a. $31 5'' \times 1''$
 - b. $124 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ "
